

on or about or between the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 2016 and the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 2016, in the County and State aforesaid, while serving as a public officer or employee, to-wit: General Counsel to the North Broward Hospital District (d/b/a Broward Health), a special taxing district created and incorporated by the Legislature of the State of Florida, did solicit another person or persons, to wit: Commissioners Rocky Rodriguez, Christopher Ure, Linda Robison, and/or Beverly Capasso, personally or through conduits or intermediaries Jack Selden and/or Richard Westling, to commit an offense prohibited by law, to wit: the violation of the Public Meetings Law also

known as the Florida Government-in-the-Sunshine Law, and in the course of such solicitation did command, encourage, hire or request such other person or persons to engage in specific conduct which would constitute such offense or an attempt to commit such offense, to wit: LYNN BARRETT did personally or through conduits or intermediaries Jack Selden and/or Richard Westling contact Commissioners Rocky Rodriguez, Christopher Ure, Linda Robison, and/or Beverly Capasso, to privately discuss at the Westin Hotel, Mario's Catalina restaurant, and/or through telephonic communications, a "reportable event" allegedly committed by North Broward Hospital District Interim CEO and President Pauline Grant, where such defacto meetings were not noticed to the public and therefore not open to the public at all times, and at said meetings matters pertaining to North Broward Hospital District, business or official acts were discussed on which foreseeable action was to be taken by the Board of Commissioners, contrary to Florida Statutes Sections 777.011, 777.04(2), 286.011(1), (2), and (3)(b) and 775.15(2)(d) and (12)(b), and

on or about or between the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 2016 and the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 2016, in the County and State aforesaid, while serving as public officers or employees, to-wit: members of the Board of Commissioners of the North Broward Hospital District (d/b/a Broward Health) and/or General Counsel to the North Broward Hospital District (d/b/a Broward Health), did then and there unlawfully agree, conspire, combine, or confederate with each other and others known and unknown to commit a criminal offense, to wit: Violation of the Public Meetings Law also known as the Florida Government-in-the-Sunshine Law in that the said ROCKY RODRIGUEZ, CHRISTOPHER URE, LINDA ROBISON, BEVERLY CAPASSO, AND LYNN BARRETT, did then and there unlawfully agree, conspire, combine, or confederate to privately

discuss that North Broward Hospital District Interim CEO and President Pauline Grant had allegedly committed a "reportable event," where such defacto meetings were not noticed to the public and therefore not open to the public at all times, and at said meetings matters pertaining to North Broward Hospital District, business or official acts were discussed on which foreseeable action was to be taken by the North Broward Hospital District Board of Commissioners, contrary to Florida Statutes Sections 777.011, 777.04(3), 286.011(1), (2), and (3)(b), and 775.15(2)(d) and (12)(b).
