

# For Immediate Release

Today, February 5, 2019 the Superior Court rendered its opinion relating to Jerry Sandusky's appeal from the lower court's order denying his petition filed pursuant to the Post-Conviction Relief Act. The opinion provided a mixed result.

The Court, in its opinion, which was 119 pages long confirmed the lower court's holding that Mr. Sandusky was not entitled to a new trial. The Superior Court, however, reversed the lower court with regard to Mr. Sandusky's sentence. Judgement of sentence was vacated by the Superior Court and the case was remanded to the lower court for resentencing. Mr. Sandusky challenged the legality of his sentence in his appeal. More specifically he argued that the trial court's position of mandatory minimum sentences was illegal. The Superior Court agreed.

Al Lindsay, Mr. Sandusky's attorney, stated that Mr. Sandusky has every intention of seeking an appeal with the Pennsylvania Supreme Court and, if necessary to pursue an appeal through Federal Court.

Mr. Sandusky asked that the following statement be communicated to the media:

We will not rest until the public understands what has happened and decision-makers acknowledge the injustice. It will take reasonable people with a "hearing heart," conscience and courage. All deserve an opportunity to discover the truth. It's time to unmask those who have been deceitful and dishonest. It's time to expose those who have hidden personal agendas. Now is the time to present the "real scandal" and all the damage that has been done. What has happened is a travesty. What will happen will be our legacy.

Mr. Lindsay indicated that he is very hopeful that a higher court will grant Mr. Sandusky a new trial. "In doing so, the court has an opportunity to correct one of the most profound injustices in the history of American Jurisprudence".
