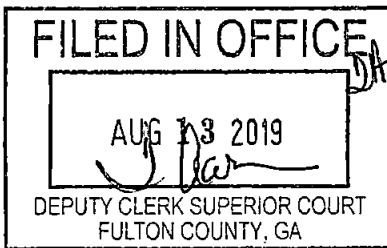

The undersigned, as prosecuting attorney, does further charge and accuse **BRYAN SCHMITT** with the offense of **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT O.C.G.A. §16-5-21**, for the said accused, in the County of Fulton and State of Georgia, on the **30th day of July, 2019**, **did unlawfully commit an aggravated assault upon the person of HAMID JAHANGARD by intentionally driving and steering a motor vehicle into and against the person of HAMID JAHANGARD, said motor vehicle being a means likely to inflict serious bodily injury when used in the manner used by accused;** -contrary to the laws of said State, the good order, peace and dignity thereof.

At 1818 hours, ChatComm 911 received a call regarding a male struck by a vehicle in front of 326 River Valley Rd. Sandy Springs Fire Engine 52 along with AMR Unit 8216 arrived and located the victim lying in the driveway to 326 River Valley Rd. The victim (Hamid Jahangard) was bleeding heavily from his ears and head. He was quickly placed in the ambulance and transported to North Fulton Hospital for evaluation and treatment. A firefighter from Engine 52 rode in the back of the ambulance to assist the EMT's. Engine 52 personnel also called for assistance from PD for traffic control.

I was dispatched at 1823 hours and arrived at 1836 hours. When I arrived, the Captain from engine 52 told me that Jahangard had serious head injuries. They had been letting vehicles pass through the accident scene but I told him that I would need to shut the roadway down. Fire personnel then shut down River Valley Rd from Amberidge Trail to Amberidge Trail. It was raining when I arrived on scene.

There was a 2011 Mercedes Benz (GA plate AXX0249) stopped in front of 326 River Valley Rd. The vehicle was parked facing north next to two large stone mailboxes.. Engine 52 was parked on the opposite side of the driveway from the Mercedes facing south. There were two large stone mailboxes at the edge of the driveway next to Engine 52. Next to those mailboxes were two green trash cans on wheels.

I then made contact with two people who were standing at the bottom of the driveway. One person was the driver of the Mercedes (Bryan Keith Schmitt). The other person was a Karime Barry. Barry lives at 318 River Valley Rd but is in the process of moving. The house (318 River Valley Rd) is owned by Hamid Jahangard. Barry told me that Jahangard had just gone for a walk.

Schmitt told me that he was driving his Mercedes north on River Valley Rd and saw Jahangard standing on the sidewalk leaning over one of the trash cans. As he got close, he saw Jahangard make a throwing motion with his arm and saw either a rock or a golf ball come out of his hand and hit his car. Barry then asked him where it hit his car. I told Barry that it was my job to ask the questions and asked her to walk up to her house and I would speak to her in a few minutes. Schmitt said that he stopped up the road, turned around and went back to where Jahangard was standing. He said that he started to do a U-turn in front of Jahangard. Schmitt asked him why he threw a golf ball at his car. He said that Jahangard told him to "fuck off, it's none of your business". At that time he started to pull into the driveway and said that Jahangard pushed one of the trash cans towards his Mercedes. He said that he swerved to miss the trash can and hit another trash can which in turn struck Jahangard knocking him to the ground. He said that he then got out of the Mercedes to check on Jahangard and stabilize his head. The neighbor across the street at 325 River Valley Rd (Jessica Woodson) came over with a towel to assist. Woodson is a registered nurse.

I called traffic Sgt. T. Sheffield and he came to the scene along with Sgt. Godfrey and Capt. Lindstrom. I told Sgt. Sheffield that Jahangard was transported to North Fulton Hospital.

I spoke to Jessica Woodson who is the neighbor across the street. I was told that she had witnessed the incident. She then told me that she didn't witness the incident. she just came walked over to check on the victim when she saw the commotion. Woodson said that the Mercedes was pulled into the driveway facing uphill. The victim was lying on the driveway behind the driver's side rear tire. His body was perpendicular to the vehicle and his leg looked mangled. His legs were under the rear of the vehicle. Woodson later wrote a statement that was turned in as evidence.

I walked back over to talk to Schmitt and Barry was standing in the middle of the road. I asked her if she would

move out of the roadway again and that I would talk to her in a few minutes.

I asked Schmitt if the victim was under his car and he said no, he was beside it at a 45 degree angle. I asked him if he had gotten angry at Jahangard for hitting his car and if he had hit him for that and he said no.

I then spoke to the firefighters and they told me that they moved the trashcans out of the driveway after the accident. They said that a truck needed to leave the house so they moved them.

I then spoke to Karime Barry and asked me who Jahangard was. She said that he owns the house that she lives in and the house is up for sale. She said that she only knew his first name Hamid. She later was able to tell me that his last name was Jahangard. I asked her how did she know what had happened. She said that she is moving and Jahangard was at the house. There are four houses that share the same driveway and the house she lives in is the first house on the left. Jahangard's SUV was parked in the driveway. She said that Jahangard was at the house waiting for some painters to arrive and went for a walk. She saw the commotion at the street and went to investigate.

Sgt. Sheffield took photos of the golf ball in the yard of 325 River Valley Rd. I then took possession of the golf ball.

I then looked at the 2011 Mercedes Benz to see what kind of damage there was to it. I saw two small dents the size of a golf ball on the passenger side rear door. I asked Schmitt about the dents and he said that the damage was old damage and I saw no damage to the vehicle from a golf ball. I looked for damage to the front of the Mercedes and saw some scratches on the front bumper from hitting the trash can. Sgt. Sheffield also took photos of the front bumper of the Mercedes. There were several small scratches on the bumper.

I saw a small amount of blood on the concrete driveway. According to the firemen, there was a lot of blood but the heavy rain washed most of it away.

Schmitt was allowed to drive his Mercedes home to 130 Hidden Falls Rd in Sandy Springs. Prior to leaving, I had him write a written statement.

Officer Needham went to North Fulton Hospital to check on the status of Jahangard. He was advised that he had bleeding on the brain after a Cat Scan of his brain was done. Officer Needham talked to his brother (Manou Jahangard) and was told that he was talking to his brother on his cell phone when he was hit. His telephone numbers are 404-819-9090 and 678-585-0450. Officer Needham remained at the hospital for awhile. Officer Needham was then advised that in addition to his head injury, his legs suffered several fractures.

At approximately 0004 hours, ChatComm received a call from the daughter of Jahangard (Fecceideh Jahangard 404-993-2930). She was wanting to know where her father's cell phone was and had tracked it to 130 Hidden Falls Lane Atlanta, Ga 30328. I knew that 130 Hidden Falls Lane was the address of Bryan Schmitt.

Sgt. Godfrey and I went to that location. We made contact with Schmitt and asked him if he had picked up his cell phone at the scene and he said no. I told him that the victim's daughter had tracked the phone to this location. I asked him if we could look in his vehicle for the cell phone and he said yes. He opened his garage door and then allowed me to look in the vehicle but I could not locate it. I called the victim's daughter and had her call his phone. We heard the phone ring and found it lodged under the driver's side windshield wiper. I took possession of the cell phone and told his daughter that I found the phone and that it would be taken in and stored at police headquarters. I

told her that the investigation was still ongoing.

I tagged both the cell phone belonging to Jahangard and the golf ball as evidence. The written statements by Woodson and Schmitt were also tagged as evidence and turned into the property room.

On 07/30/2019, I started work at 1800 hours. Officer Giloavani had been dispatched to an accident call on GA 400 South at Hammond Drive. I cancelled him and told ChatComm that I would handle his accident call. I arrived on scene in the area of GA 400 but could not locate the accident. I asked ChatComm if they would call the 911 caller back to see if they could give me a better location.

I then pulled up the calls holding while ChatComm did that. I saw an EMD Bravo with Law call holding and clicked on the notes. The first line of the call said "man struck by vehicle". I read further into the call and saw that fire requested a C in page and that a firefighter was riding in the ambulance. The call went further and requested police for traffic control.

I told ChatComm to take me off the accident I was looking for and to show me enroute to River Valley Rd to handle the man struck by vehicle call. A minute later, Sgt. Godfrey called me to ask me what I was enroute to because he now heard me say over the radio "person struck by vehicle". I told him I didn't know what the call was. I saw it and dispatched myself to it. Traffic Sgt. Sheffield then called me asking the same and I told him that I didn't know but would advise when I pulled on scene.

When I arrived on scene, Capt. Green was directing traffic around the fire engine. He said that the victim had already been transported. I told him that I would have to close the road down.

On 07/30/2019 around 1818 hours, I heard Officer Head enroute to a person struck by auto at 326 River Valley Rd, Sandy Springs Ga 30328. I called Officer Head and told him to advise me the injury status as soon as he could. I heard Officer Head arrive on scene and after a short time on scene, Officer Head called me and told me that I was needed.

I arrived on scene and Officer Head told me that the victim (Hamid Jahangard) had thrown a golf ball at the offender's (Bryan Schmitt) vehicle. I asked Officer Head, if he had located the golf ball. He said yes, and pointed across the street to 325 River Valley Rd. I could see the golf ball in the yard, just off a walk path. Officer Head told me that the Mr. Jahangard was bleeding from the head and was transported to North Fulton Hospital. I then learned that the vehicle and trash cans had been moved before my arrival. While driving over to the incident location, it was storming with heavy rain and lightening. I could see a small amount of blood still in the driveway, that had not been washed away.

I asked who moved the trash cans, Mr. Schmitt told me that one of the fireman or EMS personnel had moved it, because of a moving truck. I was approached by Karime Barry. Mrs. Barry stated that was a lie. Mrs. Barry then went across to 325 River Valley Dr and started talking with Jessica Woodson. Mrs. Barry then started yelling, "He is lying". I walked over to Mrs. Barry and told her to leave the scene. I didn't need her interviewing a witness.

I then started taking pictures of the incident location. I took photographs of the trash cans, vehicle, street, blood in the drive way and the golf ball across the street. Capt. Lindstrom arrived on scene and I briefed him on what was going on. I then spoke to him about my concern, that this isn't a traffic accident, its more of an aggravated assault. I called Sgt. Ortega and briefed him on what had happened and made arrangements to meet with CID the following morning. I told him that due to evidence being moved, rain washing the majority of the blood away, there was no need for CID to respond to the scene. The following morning I met with CID and they took over the investigation. I sent the pictures to CSI (Det. Werner) so they could be put on a disk.

On 08/01/2019, Detective T. Wilson and I conducted a canvass of the area. We went to various homes in the neighborhood near the incident location, in an effort to speak with citizens and look for video surveillance. My efforts are as follows:

310 River Valley Rd- I met with resident Emil Horesh. Mr. Horesh did not witness the event. No video.

314 River Valley Rd- No answer at the time of the canvass. I left my card. I received a call from a Mr. McGhee who resides there. We was not home when the incident occurred. No video.

318 River Valley Rd- No answer. I left my business card.

322 River Valley Rd- I met with Angela Evans. Mrs. Evans was not home at the time. Her juvenile daughter was home but was not outside. We spoke with the juvenile and she had nothing to add. Mrs. Evans stated that driveway is a blind driveway and is not surprised that something happened.

326 River Valley Rd- No answer. I left my business card.

On August 1, 2019, Detective J.T. Williams brought bloody clothing into the secure CSI Lab that belonged to the victim. Detective Williams stated the clothes were covered in blood and needed to be dried before being placed into Evidence. The Drying Cabinet was sterilized prior to placing any items inside. I put on a clean pair of purple nitrile gloves and laid brown butcher paper on the bottom of the drying cabinet to catch any particles that may fall off the evidence. Detective Williams put on a clean pair of purple nitrile gloves and unpackaged the evidence. Detective Williams placed a pair of Lee Modern blue jeans, white Polo underwear, a blue and white checkered shirt, and a pair of brownish red slip on shoes inside the drying chamber. The jeans, underwear and shirt had a reddish brown substance on them consistent with that of blood.

Sgt. Sheffield provided me with the photographs that he took with his City cell phone of the scene which took place on July 30, 2019, when he responded to the incident location. I downloaded the photographs he provided to save to a photo DVD. A green Waste Management trash can with a black lid S#07010727 was photographed, which was struck by the suspect's vehicle during the incident. Detective J.T. Williams request I recover the trash can that was struck during the incident when I go to the scene to take photographs of the area.

On August 1, 2019, I (CSI Detective Werner #260) responded to driveway of 326 River Valley Road. I took digital photographs with my department issued Nikon D7200 DSLR camera of the driveway area. impounded the vehicle to be transported to Police Headquarters to be processed. I transported the cell phone to Police Headquarters in my city issued vehicle. I placed the faraday bag with phone inside a Ramsey box located inside the secure CSI Lab. I removed the phone from the faraday bag and plugged it in, so it would remain charged inside the Ramsey box.

On August 2, 2019, I (CSI Detective Werner #260) began to process the suspect's vehicle. I then put on a new pair of purple nitrile gloves and prepared to take a sample of the black hair-like substance from the front fender. I then sterilized a pair of plastic evidence tweezers using Super Sani-Cloth Germicidal Disposable wipes and allowed the tweezers to dry. After the tweezers had sterilized I collected the black hair-like substance from the fender and placed the hair-like substance into a small clear zip lock style bag. The presumed blood swab samples were all placed in separate brown paper evidence bags and taped closed. The three samples were then placed into a larger brown paper evidence bag, sealed with white evidence tape and initialed. I placed the green Waste Management trash can with the black lid next to the suspect vehicle in the secure CSI processing cage and photographed the items side by side. I photographed the items with and without a scale.

A-Tow Wrecker service was requested to the secure CSI processing cage to lift the vehicle off the ground so the bottom of the vehicle could be processed. The rear of the vehicle was lifted by the rear tires using the wrecker. I crawled under the rear of the vehicle and did not locate anything of evidentiary value. A-Tow wrecker set the suspect vehicle back on the ground and lifted the vehicle up by the front tires.

On August 5, 2019, I (CSI Detective Werner #260) removed the bloody clothing from the drying cabinet. The clothing had been drying inside the drying cabinet inside the secure CSI Lab for approximately 4 days. I rolled out a clean layer of brown butcher paper on the processing table inside the CSI Lab. I laid the clothing on the table to be photographed. I took digital photographs with my department issued Nikon D7200 DSI R camera of: a pair of Lee Modern blue jeans, white Polo underwear, a blue and white checkered shirt, and a pair of brownish red slip on shoes.

The blue jeans, the blue and white shirt, and the white underwear appeared to have been cut off the victim. I first documented the blue and white shirt. The shirt had several large reddish brown stains consistent with that of blood over the entire area of the shirt. I photographed the blue and white shirt with and without a scale. While documenting the shirt I located some items in the shirt pocket of the victim's shirt. I pulled out \$333.00 of U.S. Currency, a personal check, 2 business cards, and a plastic case. I placed all the items on the evidence table and photographed them for documentation. Next I documented the white polo underwear. The sides of the underwear were cut and several areas on the white underwear had reddish brown stains consistent with that of blood. I photographed the white underwear with and without a scale. Next I documented the blue jeans which had cut marks all of them, the jeans were completely cut in half. What appeared to the front of the jeans, had dark reddish brown stains on the thigh area of the jeans. I photographed the blue jeans with and without a scale. Next I documented the reddish brown slip on shoes. I photographed the reddish brown slip on shoes with and without a scale. I turned the shoes over and noticed the left shoe had a tear in it and what appears to be red clay on the bottom of it.

I folded the victim's clothes and placed them all on the butcher paper that was removed from the bottom of the drying cabinet. I folded the victim's clothes inside the brown butcher paper and placed the entire bundle inside a large brown paper evidence bag, sealed it with white evidence tape and initialed to be placed in Evidence at Police Headquarters.

The photographs from processing the green and black Waste Management trash can and the victims clothing were transferred to a photo DVD, picture ID: Trash Can CEW_0001 - CEW_0021 and Victims Clothing CEW_0022 - CEW_0072. A copy of the photo DVD was given to Detective J.T. Williams for his case file. A second photo DVD was packaged in a yellow evidence envelop sealed with white evidence tape and initialed to be placed in Evidence at Police Headquarters.

On August 5, 2019, I (CSI Detective Werner #260) accompanied Detective J.T. Williams to 325 River Valley Rd. to obtain a copy of the surveillance camera recording from this residence. The surveillance camera was located on the corner of the garage. We met with a John Knox from "NControl" who was able to provide us with a copy of the video

On August 5, 2019, I returned from vacation and was made aware the details of this case. I was not involved in the initial investigation of this case prior to this date.

On August 7, 2019, Detective JT Williams provided me with a Search Warrant for the suspect's phone in this case. The phone, a black iPhone 7, with IMEI: 356560087324300, was already in the secure CSI lab where I work.

The victim's phone, a black iPhone 7 Plus, with IMEI: 353815088229707, was in Property & Evidence at Police Headquarters. Detective JT Williams also requested I process/search the victim's phone with some specific search criteria.

He wanted me to look for any correlation between the victim (Hamid Jahangard) and suspect (Bryan Schmitt) to see if they possibly knew one another.

I signed the victim's iPhone 7 Plus out of Property & Evidence. It was properly packaged in a faraday bag, preventing any electronic communication in or out of the device.

I obtained a file system extraction from the iPhone 7 Plus. I loaded that file system extraction into the Cellebrite Physical Analyzer program (version 7.22). The Physical Analyzer program parses the data into a much easier to understand format.

Detective JT Williams requested I search only "Bryan", "Schmitt", "Bryan Schmitt", the phone number 404-906-0497, also searched as 4049060497. Utilizing the search function built in to the Physical Analyzer program, I searched those specific names and numbers and did not find any matches to indicate any association with the victim's phone and any of those names or that phone number.

He also requested I verify an outgoing call close to the time of the incident to the victim's brother, phone number 404-819-9090. I did see an outgoing call from the victim's phone to that number at 17:37 for 1:25 seconds. Detective Williams then explained that he wished to return the phone to the family on this date and did not need any further information from the phone. The phone was signed over to Detective JT Williams on a Property & Evidence sheet.

I then moved on to the suspect's iPhone 7. The iPhone 7 was in a Ramsey box in the CSI lab. The Ramsey box is a container which prevents a mobile device (cell phone in this case) from connecting to a cell phone provider or a wireless internet connection, much like a Faraday bag, only bigger. Our Ramsey box has an opening lined with special gloves that go inside the box that allow you the ability to physically manipulate the device (phone) while viewing the

phone through a transparent window at the top of the box.

With the phone still in the Ramsey box, I removed the SIM card from the phone. This additional step helps to prevent any unwanted connection to the service provider of the phone that could change or wipe (delete) any data on the device.

With the SIM card removed and confirming the phone was airplane mode, I removed the phone from Ramsey box.

In preparation of conducting an extraction of the data from the phone with my digital forensic tools, I examined it and the search warrant.

The Fulton County search warrant Docket No: 18025730, Warrant No: SW-018285, signed by The Honorable Judge John DeFoor II, provided me with the legal authority to conduct the examination of the device.

On August 7, 2019, I obtained a file system extraction from the iPhone 7. On August 8, 2019, I loaded that file system extraction into the Cellebrite Physical Analyzer program (version 7.22). The Physical Analyzer program parses the data into a much easier to understand format. I then ran a virus scan on the extraction to see if any viruses were detected. No viruses were detected.

The search warrant contained a specific clause that none of the data will be reviewed by "any SSPD officer until we are cleared to do so by the DA's office."

For that reason, I did not conduct any analysis of the data from the phone. That will be the responsibility of the DA's office and the case Detective.

Within the Physical Analyzer Program, I created a report with all of the parsed data from the extraction in the UFED Reader format. I also created a copy of the report in PDF format. As instructed by Detective JT Williams, the report did not include any digital photos, videos, or health/activity data as it does not pertain to the case.

The Cellebrite UFED Reader Report is a report containing a comprehensive illustration of the all the data I obtained. Within the UFED Reader, additional reports can be made by whomever is reviewing the data. Items can be bookmarked, exported, sorted, etc.

In addition to the report, I created a copy of all device photos I took of the phone prior to beginning the extraction. I

On Tuesday July 30th, 2019 at approximately 2045 hours I was notified by Sgt. Tim Sheffield of a person who had been hit by a car earlier in the evening at 326 River Valley Road, Fulton County, Sandy Springs Georgia 30328. Sgt. Sheffield is a Sergeant with our traffic / hit and run unit.

Sgt. Sheffield explained he and traffic Officer J. Head had worked the scene, located no eyewitnesses, did not locate any skid marks or other physical evidence to process and had learned that tangible items at the scene (vehicle that hit the pedestrian and garbage cans) had been moved prior to their arrival. Sgt. Sheffield also stated due to a very large thunderstorm all the blood evidence had been washed away. I asked him if he thought this was an accident or intentional to which he stated they were now thinking this may have been an intentional act stemming from an argument between two males near the driveway of 326 River Valley Road and that the victim had serious head injuries.

Sgt. Sheffield finally stated he had also briefed criminal investigations Sgt. Ortega on this case and that all of us were meeting tomorrow, Wednesday July 31st, 2019 at 1300 in the criminal investigations conference room:

Wednesday July 31st, 2019:

At 1300 hours Sgt. Sheffield, Sgt. Lapides, Sgt. Ortega, Sgt. Jon Williams, Traffic Officer John Head, Det. Delancy, CSI Werner and I go over this case.

We learn the driver of the car is Bryan Schmitt, he was driving a 2011 Gray Mercedes CLS 550 bearing Georgia license plate AXX0249, stayed on the scene the entire time and wrote out a statement for Officer Head.

Schmitt statement was as follows:

"I was driving home NE on River Valley around 5:15 a man was standing by side of road next to trash cans. He made a throwing motion with his arm and I saw a white object strike my car. I made a U-turn & came back to pull into the driveway by the man to check for damage to my car. I rolled down my window to ask why he'd throw something at my car. He yelled at me to "Fuck you, it's none of your business." When I attempted to pull into the driveway he pushed a trash can at me. I swerved to right to miss it & ended up hitting a second trash can. When I came to stop he was lying on other side of first trash can. The neighbor across street brought a towel and we stabilized his head until EMT's arrived."

Sgt. Sheffield explained to me that there were indeed two green trash cans on scene and upon his arrival both were on the right side of the driveway next to a tall rock design mailbox. He also stated they had found a golf ball across the street (325 River Valley Road) from the scene in a flower garden. Sgt. Sheffield stated he took pictures of the scene to include the garbage cans, driveway, the golf ball and Schmitt's vehicle.

Officer Head stated he had also obtained a statement from Jessica Woodson (404-917-4833) who lives across the street at 325 River Valley Road. Jessica Woodson is a nurse who rendered aid to the victim shortly after he was hit by the car. One thing I noted from her statement was the following:

"I asked the driver what happened and he explained that the victim had hit his car with a ball while he was driving he then turned his car around at which time the victim pushed a garbage can into his car which bounced off of his car and knocked the victim down, the garbage can was located in front of the drivers car when I came to assist."

Officer Head stated later that night, specifically four minutes after midnight he was contacted by Chatcomm who informed him they received a call from the victim's family who used a tracking application and that the victim's phone was showing to be at 130 Hidden Falls Lane, Fulton County, Sandy Springs Georgia 30328 which is the address of Bryan Schmitt. Officer Head stated they went to the address, made contact with Schmitt who stated he did not have the phone. They then checked Schmitt's car and had the family call his phone which was located under the driver's side windshield wiper.

I then obtained the 911 call and the CAD report for this call. The 911 caller is Donald Utroska (773-383-2147). I learned he was traveling on River Valley Road towards Abernathy Road. There is a van in front of him thus making him the second vehicle back from Schmitt's Mercedes. Utroska stated while driving he is talking to his father via his cell phone. He stated out of nowhere a Mercedes made a quick left turn into a driveway and he immediately saw a 90 gallon garbage can get knocked into the air. He yelled "oh shit" and upon pulling up to the driveway observed the victim lying on the ground with blood coming out his head. He jumped out of his car and stated the male driver of the Mercedes yelled at him to call 911 and that this person had jumped out in front of him. Please refer to the 911 call for his exact statements. Donald stated the driver later told him about the golf ball being thrown, speaking to the male at the driveway and that the male had "jumped out in front of him". I explained to Donald I would be back in touch with him to get a formal, recorded statement concerning this.

I then drove to North Fulton Hospital and met the victims two daughters, Sepeideh and Sahar Jahangard. I explained to them who I was, what we were investigating and provided them with my contact information.

I then met with Manoucher Jahangard in a conference room on the 2nd floor of the I.C.U.

Manoucher is the brother of the victim Hamid. Manoucher explained to me that his brother owns the house at 326 River Valley Road and is currently renting it out. He told me Hamid was standing at the bottom of the driveway because he was waiting for some painters to arrive so he could show them what house and specifically what needed to be painted. The painters were having a hard time locating the house so Hamid was going to flag them down. Manoucher stated he was on the phone with Hamid and heard someone in English yelling at him, but could not make out what exactly was being said. He stated he then heard his brother two times say, "I did not throw anything. I did not throw anything, get out my face, get out my face and then the line went dead. Manoucher stated he feared the worse and drove to the house as he was not far away. Upon arrival he stated he observed EMS treating Hamid and upon telling EMS he was his brother he was placed in the front seat of the ambulance and went to the hospital with him. He showed me his phone where Hamid had called him at 1737 hours and the phone call was one minute and twenty five seconds long. The original 911 call from Donald Utroska is at 1740 hours.

I briefly walked into Hamid's I.C.U. room and discovered several persons attending to him due to blood pressure issues. I quickly took a picture of his face and left. His right eye has traditional racooning which is evidence of a basal skull fracture.

I then spoke to Dr. Weaver (404-805-4988) who informed me of the following:

- the victim has a massive skull fracture
- the brain is swelling and continues to worsen
- there is nothing they can do at this point, the injury to the brain is irreversible
- he will not make it past the next 48 hours
- his left leg has fractures / has no immediate details on this as they have been concentrating on his brain injuries

A voicemail has been left with Bryan Schmitt requesting him to call us so we can arrange a time for him to come to the Sandy Springs Police Department so we may talk to him about this some more.

I then drove to 326 River Valley Road and met with Officer Head. He walked me through the scene and also showed me where they had located the golf ball. I then spoke to Jessica Woodson who is the resident of 325 River Valley Road. She came outside and walked me through where the car was, what direction it was facing, where the garbage can was that was hit and the location of the second garbage can. She stated when she arrived there was a light colored garbage can in front of the silver Mercedes knocked over with the top open. There was a second garbage can, dark

green, which was next to the mailbox, literally right up against it. When I asked her where the victim was she told me partially under the car. Specifically she stated his left leg was mutilated, pinned back one hundred and eighty degrees the wrong way up by his left knee. She stated both legs were under the car, between the driver's side back tire and near the trunk. I had her confirm this and she made it clear the victims legs were behind the driver's side back tire, trunk area and the left leg looked "stuck" around the back bumper. She also stated there was a massive amount of blood "pouring" out of his ears. Woodson stated she asked the driver what happened and that his answer did not make sense. She stated the driver of the Mercedes told her about the altercation and that upon pulling into the driveway the victim pushed a garbage can into his car which bounced off of his car and knocked the victim down. She stated he was lying and that he did not knock him down, he ran him over. As I was finishing up talking to Woodson, I observed that she has surveillance video cameras around the house. I inquired with her on the video's angle and she stated she was not sure. I thanked Woodson for her time and explained to her that I would be back in touch with her about this as I was going to need to get a formal recorded statement from her.

I learn from Officer Head that attorney Steve Weiner has emailed him back and stated he had been notified by Bryan Schmitt. I called attorney Weiner who stated he will talk to his client and they will come see me tomorrow.

Thursday August 1st 2019:

I meet the family at 0500 hours as victim Hamid is coming out of his final cat scan. I speak to the charge nurse who stated the Doctors will be meeting with the family later today, will conduct one more test, but he is showing no brain activity and is not expected to make it through the evening. I take custody of the clothing, shoes and personal property that was on his person upon arrival at the hospital. I am allowed to take pictures of his body. His left knee is swollen to the size of a pie plate and there are abrasions on his left shin. The charge nurse checked Hamid's chart and stated the tibia and fibula of his left leg were broken in various places. The items are taken to the SSPD CID building and were placed into the CSI laboratory dryer.

Wilson and CSI Werner are also sent out to 326 River Valley Road to collect the garbage can, take more scene pictures and conduct a canvass to see if any other witnesses could be located. Please refer to Det. Delaney's supplemental report for exact details. The garbage can that was hit by Schmitt was located and turned into SSPD as evidence.

Later that day I am notified by Fay Motaehari (404-784-2499) who is the victim's real-estate agent. I asked her if she was on scene that day or if she knew of any witnesses we needed to talk to. She stated she was not there and only knew of Karime Barry who was moving out of 318 River Valley Road that day and was there when fire rescue / EMS arrived. I explained to her I had all of her contact information and would be in touch with her later. I asked Fay about the house across the street and the video camera system. Fay stated she knows the system designer and would pass his information along to me as soon as she can.

At 1145 hours I am notified by attorney Steve Wiener who informs me that Bryan Schmitt is seeking other attorneys in this case and that he will call me later today.

At 1340 hours Fulton County Magistrate Court Judge Jeffrey Frazier signs search warrant number SW-018237 / Docket number E025677 for the following:

-130 Hidden Falls Lane NW, Fulton County, Sandy Springs Georgia 30328, the residence of Bryan Schmitt
-this search warrant is to seize his 2011 Gray Mercedes CLS550, Georgia license plate AXX0249,

-also to seize the cell phone of Bryan Schmitt, AT&T mobile of 404-906-0497.

I stop at North Fulton Hospital on the way home and meet with family. They are multiple persons crying in the waiting room, hallway and near Hamid's room. His daughters inform me that both neurosurgeons have declared him brain dead, that there is one more test that is going to be done within the hour but "it is over". The charge nurse stated he will call me in an hour or two and let me know.

I notify senior investigator Reents with the Fulton County Medical Examiner's Office and provide him with all the information on the victim and that they will be getting a call later tonight or tomorrow concerning Hamid Jahangard.

At 1645 hours I am notified that Hamid Jahangard has been officially pronounced brain dead and will remain on life

At 0245 hours Hamid Jahangard was received at the Fulton County Medical Examiner's Office. The case number for the medical examiner's office is 19-1378

At 0345 hours, a briefing is conducted at the SSPD CID room with several officers and Detectives.

We travel to 130 Hidden Falls Lane and execute the search warrant that was signed on yesterday's date by Judge Frazier. The warrant is executed without incident and we take custody of Schmitt's cell phone and his vehicle via A-tow. It should be noted when I was standing in the kitchen waiting for Schmitt to hand over his phone he made the comment, "you all sure picked a fine time for this" to which I stated "yes we sure did, the victim was taken off life support yesterday and is dead". Schmitt began to shake. Upon Schmitt handing me his phone, I immediately pulled out a faraday bag from my pants pocket and placed that phone into it. I left a copy of the warrant with him and an inventory sheet noting the two items taken.

The vehicle is brought back to the SSPD CID cage area and the phone is placed into the CSI crime lab.

Later that morning after sunrise the vehicle is processed and is also processed in comparison with the garbage can. Please refer to CSI Werner supplemental report for exact details. A copy of the search warrant as well as an inventory list are left inside the vehicle before it is impounded to A-tow.

It should be noted at approximately 1045 hours I received a phone call from John Garland and Don Samuel. We briefly speak and I learn they are not going to allow Bryan Schmitt to make any more statements. They object to us examining Schmitt's cell phone regarding any communication between him, his wife or with council deeming it as privileged information. Moments later Don Samuel sends me the following text:

Detective Williams: Thanks for talking with John Garland and me this morning. As we discussed, we would object to any examination of the contents of Mr. Schmitt's cell phone to the extent that it would reveal any confidential marital

I confer with the Fulton County DA's office and am told to have the entire content of the phone dumped to an electronic storage device, not to view any of it and to bring it to the DA's office. From there, it will be provide to a "tank team" who can filter out privileged communications. I brief CSI Sawtell on this and we decide to treat it like we do child pornography. The contents will be dumped onto an electronic storage device, will be encrypted with a pass code that only the persons deemed allowed to examine the phone by the D.A.'s office will have access to.

At 1219 hours I receive an email from Fay Motahari and she has provided me with the information pertaining to the surveillance system at 325 River Valley Road.

I then call and speak with Karime Barry (678-596-5737). Barry stated she was renting from Hamid, was living at 318 River Valley Road and is now in Mexico. She was upset at the police response time, how the scene was handled and that the suspect was allowed to move his car. I explained to her these things were being dealt with and asked her if she had any viable information for us. Barry stated she had taken some pictures with her phone of the driveway, the garbage can and of the suspect vehicle when he was moving it. Barry texted me the pictures. It should be noted the picture of the suspect moving his vehicle shows a large stain of blood where the victim's head was. The rain has not washed it all away yet and this is the only picture we have showing blood evidence.

Monday August 5th 2019:

At 1020 hours I interview 911 caller Donald Ray Utroska at the SSPD CID building, interview room one. The interview is digitally recorded. Utroska walks me through what he saw, what the victim said to him about "he jumped out in front of me", watching the garbage can get knocked into the air and how the Mercedes made the turn quickly. I provided him with pictures of the driveway and had him draw out where the car was and where the body was. He places the car on the far right side of the driveway and places the victim's head near the blood stain. Please refer to the CD for exact details.

At 1235 hours, CSI Werner and I meet with John M Knox who is the Electronic Systems Designer of NControl home monitoring at 325 River Valley Road. Knox takes us downstairs where the server is and shows us where one of the camera's that covers the residents driveway catches about 80 percent of the driveway across the street at 326 River Valley Road.

We are able view the following:

- victim walking down driveway, standing at the bottom to the right where the garbage cans were
- Bryan Schmitt drives by, as he passes the driveway he hits his break
- Schmitt pulls back up and remains stationary for twenty five seconds by 326 River Valley Road
- Two cars pass him on the wrong side of road
- he quickly makes a left and starts to accelerate, you cannot see impact
- victim Hamid is slammed to the ground, head bounces twice off pavement and his body is rotating
- Donald Utroska stops his car and jumps out

The video is saved to a thumb drive and CSI Werner takes it back to the SSPD CSI lab and uses various programs to clean / enhance it.

Tuesday August 6th 2019:

I am called into the CSI laboratory where I am showed the updated video. The video clearly shows a tremendous amount of force was used to twist and slam the victim down on the driveway. It should be noted that you can clearly see he is on the right side of the driveway, close to the road and his head bounces what appears to be two times. You can now also see a golf ball slowly roll down the driveway of 325 River Valley and roll into the flower garden. Just after impact, we see a Coolray heating and air van drive by. It slows down almost to a stop then Donald Utroska pulls up and jumps out.

I then went back to the driveway at 326 River Valley Road and measured the bottom of it. It measured twenty three feet and four inches.

issued Olympus recorder. Woodson explains to me the following:

- she works from home
- sits in front a large glass window
- can clearly see her front yard, across the street
- on July 30th looked up and saw a male on the driveway with blood pouring out his head
- ran over to assist
- observed his left leg mangled, bent in the wrong direction with the toe area under the bumper
- massive bleeding from his head
- vehicle had clearly ran the victim over
- driver tried to pull the body out, she told him not and to stop
- driver told her the victim pushed a garbage can into his car which bounced off of his car and knocked the victim down

I then showed Woodson pictures of the driveway and had her draw where the vehicle was and where the body was as well. Her drawings were very close to Donald Utroska's and she puts the victim's head literally where the blood stain was. It should be noted the pictures I am showing them are a street side view, looking up the driveway that were taken the next day.

I then make contact with Andy Piercefield who is the president of Coolray, Mr. Plumber and BriteBox.

I explain to him our situation and provided him with the date and time. He stated he would look into this and would be back in touch with me.

I then interview Tim Sikes (404-838-5077) who is a driver / mover for Atlanta Relocation services. The interview was recorded on my departmental issued Olympus recorder. Sikes explains to me he was hired by Karime Berry as she was moving out from 318 River Valley Road. It should be noted the driveway where the incident occurred services four separate houses to include 318. It is a long driveway that goes up hill to the individual homes. Before the incident occurred, Sikes had left the incident location with a load of property that he took to his warehouse. Upon returning back, he noticed the fire department out there directing traffic and a car blocking the driveway. Sikes parks at the gate of 325 River Valley Road and not knowing what was going on requests that he be allowed to pull up the hill to continue his work. He stated one of the fire fighters moved the garbage can and the vehicle was allowed to move out of his way.

I then show him the same pictures I showed Utroska and Woodson, I then ask him to draw on the driveway where the car and body were. His drawing is similar to Utroska and Woodson.

I then meet CSI Sawtell in his laboratory as he is examining the victim's cell phone. It should be noted the screen has a strike mark on it and is cracked which CSI Sawtell photographed. We analyze his phone and discovered where he called his brother Manoucher Jahangard at 1737 hours. The call lasted for one minute and twenty five seconds then ends. Manoucher Jahangard tried to call him back twice but was not answered and were labeled as missed calls. There were multiple other missed calls as well. Manoucher Jahangard is the last person to speak to victim Hamid Jahangard before being hit. CSI Sawtell then analyzed the victims phone to see if it had any common calls, text messages or emails with Bryan Schmitt. None were noted and at this time we believe the two do not know each other or have any type of business / personal relationship. CSI Sawtell completes a chain of custody form and signs out the victim's I-phone to me.

I then go to property and evidence and sign out \$333.00 in cash, two business cards and a check that were in the victims possession.

I then meet the victim's two daughters Sepeideh and Sahar Jahangard at Patterson and Son's Funeral home in Sandy Springs. I give them their father's cell phone, the money and the check. The property and evidence forms are signed documenting the return of these items. Upon Sepeideh looking at her father's phone she stated the damage to the screen is new. Specifically she stated he had it fixed two weeks ago and has the receipt. I explained to her that we believe the damage is from the phone being vaulted out of their father's hands and hitting the car. I explain to them the evidence we have thus far and anticipate making an arrest on Monday August 12th 2019.

Later that afternoon I receive a phone call from Andy Piercefield and learn that they have found the video. I notify CSI Sawtell who informs me he has it and will be working to lighten it up a little.

I review the video from the Coolray vehicle of Mokraïne Lhocine. Mokraïne's camera captured the following:

-the Mercedes stopped in its lane of travel across from the driveway of 326 River Valley Road
-you can barely see the victims white shirt and his head as he is on the other side of the garbage cans
-two vehicles pass the Mercedes on the wrong side of the road
-the Mercedes makes a quick left turn in front of the Coolray van and shoots into the driveway
-there is a violent collision and the Mercedes front right tire, front end comes off the ground
-you see one garbage can go straight back up the driveway
-as Mokraine pulls up he slows down considerably
-you see Bryan Schmitt run to the victim whose legs are under the car
-as Schmitt assesses the victim it appears he rolls him over a little
-there is a massive amount of blood that starts to shoot up and out of the victims head
-as Mokraine continues to slowly roll by you see a large pool of blood running down the driveway towards the road from the victim's head

The statement Schmitt made to Utroska and Woodson along with the written statement provided to Officer Head do not match the video evidence.

Schmitt's vehicle plows into the driveway and is not the type of driving for someone to "turn around", "swerve to miss a garbage can", "he pushed a garbage can into my car and bounced off it and was knocked down" or "he jumped in front of my car".

The driveway is twenty three feet and four inches wide at the bottom with plenty of room for Schmitt to have turned around without coming close to the victim. The speed used to vault the garbage can, lift the front end of his car up and to slam the victim down so hard it causes a massive skull fracture where blood is squirting out his ears seconds after impact is not an accident.
