ORDER DISMISSING CHAPTER 11 CASE

On January 26, 2021, this case came before the Court for hearing on Judgment Creditors' Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Cases ("Motion to Dismiss") filed by Creditors Pinpoint Multi-Strategy Master Fund, Value Partners Fixed Income SPC – Value Partners Credit Opportunities Fund SPC, and Value Partners Greater China High Yield Income Fund (collectively "Judgment Creditors"), ECF No. 126; Judgment Creditors' Supplement to their Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Case, ECF No. 175; Debtors' Response in Opposition to Judgment Creditors' Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Cases, ECF No. 181; Supplemental Response in Opposition to Judgment Creditors' Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Cases, ECF No. 208; Judgment Creditors' (I) Reply in Further Support of Their Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Cases and (II) Opposition to Debtors' Motion for Authority to Enter into a Line of Credit, ECF No. 215; and Statement of Rolta Advizex Technologies, LLC in Connection with Judgment Creditors' Motion to Dismiss the Debtors' Chapter 11 Cases, ECF No. 220; as well as various other pending motions.

The Court carefully considered the pleadings, arguments of counsel, and the substantive law, and for the reasons stated on the record finds that this case should be dismissed, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 1112(b), because the Debtor does not have a realistic ability to effectively reorganize.

See also In re Albany Partners, Ltd., 749 F.2d 670 (11th Cir. 1984) and *In re Pegasus Wireless Corporation*, 391 Fed. Appx. 802 (11th Cir. 2010).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Motion to Dismiss is hereby **APPROVED** and the above styled case is hereby **DISMISSED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other pending motions in this case are **MOOT**.
